Date:1/2/2024 Venue: Botany Herbal Garden and Seminar Hall The programme began at 10 AM in the Herbal garden of Department of Botany with a silent prayer. Dr. Shintu P.V., Head of the Department and Co-ordinator of the programme welcomed the gathering.
